






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## THE NUMBERS

an it be true? Is movie going really recession proof? It is true that \$9.7 billion was accumulated in 2008, breaking the high mark of \$9.6 set in 2007. But the sad fact is that ticket price inflation accounted for the new record. Like an iceberg, what you see above the waterline does not give you the true picture. Actual ticket sales have fallen. The highest yearly attendance was six years ago in 2002 when 1.6 billion people bought tickets to the movies. 2007 came in at 1.4. 2008 is estimated at 1.3. The downward spiral needs to be flattened and reversed. Marquee box office numbers are not a bridge over troubled waters.

Like the democrats in congress, the "indies" have all but taken over the Academy Awards. The nominations this year reflect that the smaller distributors garnered 60% of the nominated films. In 2008, and for the last four years, the 150 "major" releases accounted for 80% of the domestic total gross. And the major distributors achieve these resounding numbers with just 20 - 25% of all yearly releases! The major distributors gave us

66% of the wide releases in 2008 and those films alone accounted for \$7.5 billion, or 77.4% of the total yearly gross.

Let's take a closer look at the "indie" art film stats. Out of the 616 new films released in 2008, 480 were indies. They contributed only \$730 million to a \$9.785 billion take for the year. That's 7.5% of the gross contributed from 78% of the releases. The top 10 indies grossed an average of \$33.9M. Number 20 in the ranking grossed \$9.5M. Number 50 grossed \$2.9M. And I think we'll stop here because you get the picture.

So you can see, as the globe is warming, Hollywood is cooling. How can the trends be reversed? Look at our soapbox arguments and think about it.

1. Let's try to market to all movie fans. Why not release movies on the same date in all media? Make it as easy as it is in hotels. The over 40's, 50's, 60's and 70's crowd either stuck at home or choosing to be entertained at home might purchase with a vengeance. DVD's and pay per view are plodding: they require large new advertising buys. Why not align

with theatrical openings? If our goal is to keep pace with our public and their lifestyles, shouldn't we allow alternative distribution channels to launch pictures alongside theaters?

- 2. Piracy, Piracy, Piracy! This is a costly Hollywood problem. Could it dissipate if Hollywood released faster into the globalized world, marketing and releasing their product from day one? This has taken place a few times, and the results were promising. Was piracy less of an issue on those titles?
- 3. Exhibitors need not tremble in their executive shoes. The digital world holds great promise here also. Yes, attendance is down, so let's start reprogramming the venues! Explore and experiment. Without losing the regular programming during the prime shank of the evening, let the kids have gaming, and compete live with big screens in India filled with kids the same age! Hollywood remakes their movies all the time. Can't the exhibitors do the same thing with their theatres? Tell us what you think at:







Vanity Fair both omitted your name from their guest lists? If you're considering holding your own Oscar night bash instead, just thinking about the food choices inspired by this year's five nominated films – from German ("The Reader") to something sublime from San Francisco "(Milk") – would make for one complicated buffet.

Instead, we consulted restaurants, past and present, to help you streamline your choices, and came up with three delicious menus, Hollywood style.

#### The "Frost/Nixon" Affair

Though Ronald Reagan got all the publicity there, former President Richard Nixon was also a regular at Chasen's, the shuttered Los Angeles dining landmark. As chief executives go, they were both in good company. Starting in 1945, every American president except Franklin D. Roosevelt (but including First Lady Eleanor) dined on Chasen's fare until 1995 when the restaurant closed. Nixon partook when he was in residence at the Western White House in San Clemente. He liked to stop in with his banker friend Bebe Rebozo after a Rams football game. Sometimes, he was in the company of his advisor Henry Kissinger. When researching my book, "Chasen's: Where Hollywood Dined, Recipes and Memories" (Angel City Press), I also learned that Chasen's was the target of its one and only bomb threat a half hour after Kissinger finished his dinner one night in 1972. The ultimate restaurateur, owner Dave Chasen installed a hot line to the White House in his office during Nixon's presidency. The restaurant also catered lunch for the dedication of the Richard Nixon Presidential Library in Yorba Linda. Obviously a red meat kind of guy, Nixon favored Hobo Steak, a rich, salt-encrusted sirloin finished at the table. Though it was never listed on the menu, people in the know would order it. Serve it with a platter

of chilled seafood first and Coupe Snowball for dessert, two of the restaurant's signature dishes. The latter is simply a scoop of vanilla ice cream sprinkled with toasted, shredded coconut and drizzled in Hershey's chocolate syrup, the topping favored by the Chasen's kitchen.

#### For the "Curious" Diner

"The Curious Case of Benjamin Button" set in New Orleans' garden district leads straight to Commander's Palace, one of the city's top restaurants and a landmark since 1880. A New Orleans-style party is hard to beat. "We take food very seriously here. Everybody cooks at home, and we all love great food," says Commander's Palace owner Lally Brennan. The restaurant's French "haute Creole" cuisine relies on local ingredients - from produce to game - with Spanish, American Indian and African influences. "Being in California, v'all dine a little lighter than we do here," allows Brennan, who recommends a meal fashioned around coffeecrusted pork loin with figs and served with a spinach salad with roasted pecans. A loin can be sliced and served on a buffet table with the salad when guests arrive. As a first course, she recommends Creole lobster bisque, served in demitasse cups or old fashioned glasses

 both ways are done in New Orleans -and eaten around the television set. For dessert, a classic bread pudding - made in a pan and served warm in a chafing dish – should be served with coffee and chicory, a local blend used since the Civil War and available at http://frenchmarketcoffee.intelliporthosting.com/Port als/FrenchMarketCoffee/Cart/?skinid=5. No New Orleans party is complete without cocktails, itself a local invention. Brennan points out that the word cocktail is derived from the French coquetiere, or egg cup, in which a Sazerac, originally an elixir made with French cognac and bitters concocted by a local pharmacy, was served. Sazeracs remain a standby, now shaken (never stirred) and poured into an old fashioned glass. Adds Brennan, "My cousin likes to start the evening with one, and I like to finish the evening with one." Another beverage idea perhaps more consistent with the movie theme: An "Elizabeth Taylor" cocktail, so-named for its lavender color that suggests the 1 egendary actress's eyes. All recipes can be found in Brennan's cookbooks, "In the Land of Cocktails" and "Commander's Wild Side: Bold Flavors for Fresh Ingredients from The Great Outdoors" (Harper Collins).

#### Eat Like a "Millionaire"

Inspired by the rags to riches story of "Slumdog Millionaire," Nikki Sood, owner with her father Sudesh of Tanzore in Beverly Hills, an award-winning Indian restaurant, recommends serving an Indian meal that combines both street foods and dishes that would please a maharajah. Begin with a refreshing lassi, a traditional yogurt drink flavored with mango or plain either sweet or salty. Pass appetizers like those sold by vendors in the streets of India, such as samosas, chicken tikka and padri chaat. Mix it up with one of Tanzore's modern takes on an appetizer, a seared ahi tuna canapé with avocado, a dollop of yogurt and Indian spices. Since Indian food is usually served family style, it suits a large crowd. For dinner, serve a buffet of yellow dal (lentils), saag paneer (spinach and cheese), chicken makhni (butter sauce chicken curry) and lamb biryani, a traditional rice dish with raita (yogurt) and spicy tandoori shrimp. Garlic or plain naan (tandori bread) is also a must. "People can get up and just grab their plates," says Sood. Finish the meal with kulfi, a traditional ice cream with pistachios. Then cheer for your favorite Slumdog!

## THE GREENROOM

Stephen Shadley

tephen Shadley is a natural when it comes to indulging the creature comforts of the Hollywood elite.

He's designed six houses for Diane Keaton, an apartment for Woody Allen, Jennifer Anniston's newest house in Beverly Hills, and a home and offices for director Robert Altman. So he found himself perfectly typecast when he was asked to design the Architectural Digest Greenroom, where industry heavyweights congregate to calm their pre-show jitters, for the 81st Annual Academy Awards.

Shadley, whose career began as a scenic artist at Fox Studios, says the '70s-era lounge, with a requisite built-in bar, grew out of a project he recently completed for an A-list movie star, a dramatic house in Trousdale Estates with a jaw-dropping view. Indeed, the focal point of Shadley's greenroom is a large photo backdrop showing a panoramic view of the city from the hills, framed by stone columns. Ironically, he adds, the backdrop was provided by J.C. Backings, the company he worked for on the Fox lot. "Greenrooms are confined spaces, so I wanted a sense of looking out," says Shadley, who has also designed two greenrooms for the Emmy Awards. He enlisted Baker Furniture to produce the main seating element, a retro, 11-foot long sofa in dark cotton with wood arms loaded with throw pillows. L.A.'s vintage furniture dealers were the source for side tables, including some he found from Baker, and a set of '70s, Brazilian rosewood-and-red leather chairs for the "garden room," actually a retreat for smokers over the Kodak Theatre's loading docks. The garden area also evokes the indoor-outdoor feature of L.A.'s modernist, one-level houses.

"It's very understated. There's a dark wood floor. I thought it was important to keep the color palette monochromatic and neutral because the glamour and color will come from the people and their clothes," says Shadley.

"I love historic homes, including '20s Spanish Colonials, but I also love the whole west coast lifestyle and the simplicity of modern design, including 1950s Case Study Houses," says the designer, who is now based in New York. "And I was always a huge fan of 'North by Northwest' with that modernist house above Mt. Rushmore."

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
